## **Revised Course Description**

Studies include the manipulation of digital images, creation of digital drawings/illustrations, and desktop publishing (single and multiple pages), Various computer software (Adobe Photoshop, Illustrator, and InDesign) will be used to develop skills in presenting ideas and designs graphically as professional architects and designers do.

#### **Physical Prints:**

Some assignments will require you to print your work on 11x17 or 24"x36". The Architecture and Interior Design Departments have color printers that should be functioning and available for your use. There is generally no cost for these. If they aren't available or not functioning, you would have to go to some large format printing service and have them printed.

You might also be required to mount your large prints on a foam board. Sometimes those are available at the Bookstore or from other places in the Valley.
