- Acquire the basic vocabulary associated with the hospitality industry.

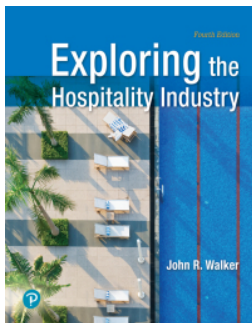
