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Course Description

Fundamentals of Cost Control course inspires students to learn cost control as an essential skill for any future chef or foodservice manager. Students begin by mastering key culinary math basics, making subsequent cost control equations easier to understand and compute. Balancing real-world industry challenges with cost control theory, the text covers topics such as recipe costing and sales price determination, purchasing and storeroom control, labor control, revenue management, and income statements and budgeting.

HOMEWORK & QUIZZES

Homework will be in the form of problems, cases or projects. The work will be reviewed in class, and it will be important to be prepared to discuss the assigned material. Students may be called on to present their solutions in class. All homework is due at the beginning of class period. Any late homework may result in an automatic 25 percent reduction. A daily or weekly quiz may be given if the instructor feels that students are not doing assigned readings and/or homework.

EXAMINATIONS

Exams will be given during the semester covering the material in the text and/or presented in class. Exams will cover concepts, and application. Plan to take the exams on the day that they are scheduled. Taking an exam later than the scheduled exam day

will result in an automatic 25 percent reduction. If you cannot take an exam on the scheduled date, you must contact me prior to the exam and make arrangements. THERE WILL NOT BE ANY MAKE-UP EXAMS allowed except in the case of a verifiable emergency. Please plan your schedules accordingly.
