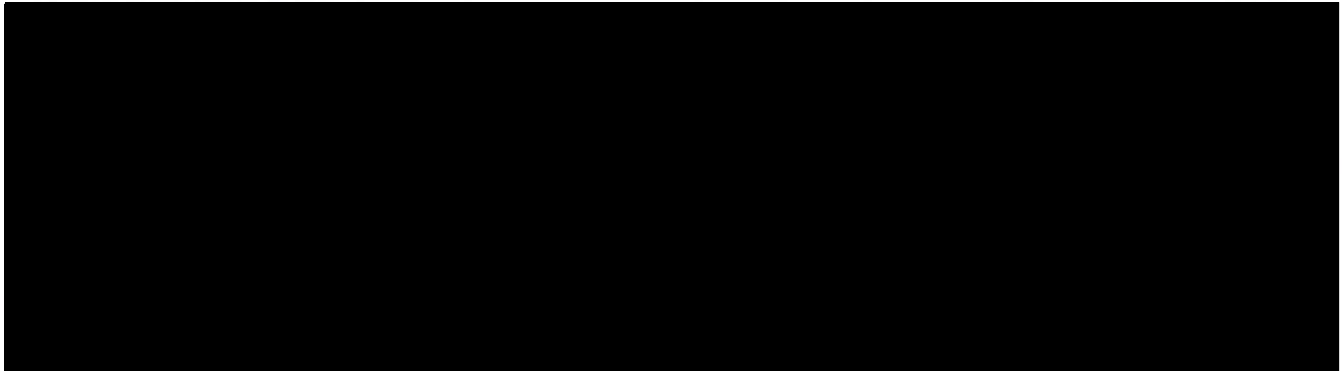


# OSHA 30 for Construction

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## Course Description

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In-depth study of OSHA safety practices and its role in the construction industry. Review workers safety procedures and practices used in the construction industry. Attendance is required to be eligible for OSHA 30 completion card.

- Identify jobsite safety hazards and understand how to correct them.
- Properly identify, inspect, fit, and don personal protective equipment.
- Understand fall hazards and fall arrest systems.
- Create a comprehensive company safety plan.
- Earn OSHA 30 completion card.

## Brief Description of Assignments/Exams

This class has 4 major grading components;

Attendance: Critical. Must have meet the minimum required hours for each section covered.

Midterm: This test consists of materials covered in the Introduction to OSHA and the Focus Four Areas of Construction

Safety Presentation: Students will prepare a 15 Minute safety presentation on a specific topic in construction.

Safety Plan: Students will begin to develop a comprehensive safety plan that is required on all construction sites.
