# **Syllabus**

#### **CSIS 1350**

## **Course Description**

A first course in computer programming with an emphasis on interactive and graphical components. No prior programming experience is required for this course. Students will create a wide variety of interactive, interesting programs from business applications to game playing. Some software will be developed and simulated as apps in a mobile environment. It is recommended students complete CSIS 1030 prior to taking this course.

This course introduces the fundamental concepts of programming using a NO-CODE platform such as <u>Thunkable</u>.(FREE). Topics include: drag and drop components, logic blocks, easy animations and open integrations to create mobile apps.

 From a set of requirements; analyze, design, code, test and document programs to meet requirements.
