Course Description

Course of study in theory and practice of dental hygiene. Focus will be on advanced instrumentation, implementation of advanced dental hygiene care, case studies and table clinics.

Course of study in theory and practice of dental hygiene. Focus will be on advanced instrumentation, implementation of advanced dental hygiene care, case studies and research.

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Evaluate, analyze, and apply procedures that are expected of a dental hygienist during a medical emergency.
- Demonstrate, communicate, and apply procedures for basic grasp, fulcrum, and instrument sharpening.
- Demonstrate knowledge of emerging technologies used to enhance the skills of the dental hygienist.
- Demonstrate and implement advanced furcation and clinical attachment level (CAL) probings and apply extraoral fulcrum techniques.
- Demonstrate and participate in role-playing communication strategies to effectively convey information and instruction to patients particularly relating to periodontal therapy.
- Identify and differentiate right, left, and triple-bend ultrasonic tips, including indications and procedures for their application.

- Evaluate root morphology of the anterior and posterior teeth and exhibit debridement techniques appropriate for these surfaces. Recognize and evaluate situations in which instrumentation may be difficult.
- Recognize and evaluate situations in which instrumentation may be difficult;
 demonstrate use of the appropriate technique and instrument.
- Demonstrate appropriate instrumentation techniques with periodontal files.
- Review and refine, and implement instrumentation techniques with area specific curets.
- Categorize dentin hypersensitivity and recommend appropriate treatment options.
- Formulate an appropriate treatment plan using evidence-based planning for periodontal treatment.
- Analyze the need for pain control during periodontal instrumentation; determine and utilize the appropriate methods of pain control.
- Assemble appropriate data to plan for periodontal maintenance and evaluation.
- Collect, assemble, and arrange assessment data on a case study patient.
- Devise and apply tobacco cessation strategies for the dental patient.

Brief Description of Assignments/Exams

Assignments: A minimum passing score of 75% is required on all assignments (including exams and quizzes). Students who score below 75% on any assignment will be required to meet with the instructor and will be placed on academic probation. Failure to pass more than one assignment may lead to course failure and possible dismissal from the Dental Hygiene program.

Quizzes: Quizzes will be given each week and completed in Canvas. Quizzes are open-book and will be 10-20 questions consisting of multiple choice, matching, and true /false. They are due at 11:59 pm the night before class. Late quizzes will not be accepted. The lowest quiz score will be dropped.

Exams: All exams must be completed at the Jordan Testing Center on the designated dates. Please note that retakes are not permitted. Each exam will consist of 50-100 questions, including multiple-choice, matching, and true/false formats.

Informative Poster Presentation: Students will be placed into groups and choose a topic of research. The Informative Poster Presentations are not original research but are required to be presented in a poster format. Top presentations will be presented during the UDHA Poster Session in February.

Preparation guidelines for Poster Session, including grading rubrics, are available in Canvas.

Case Study: The purpose of the CASE STUDY is to provide the student with experience in all aspects of Dental Hygiene Care to a specific patient. This includes a review of medical history, assessment of the patient's oral/dental condition, diagnosis of dental classification, treatment planning, implementation, and evaluation of treatment. Preparation guidelines for Case Study, including grading rubrics, are available in Canvas. It is required to complete a minimum of all 4 quadrants of scaling to be complete. If all 4 quadrants of re-evaluation are not complete, a 10% deduction will be assigned. Instructions and Rubrics can be found in Canvas. Note that all 4 quadrants, you will earn an Incomplete in the course.
