

Late policy:

Exams must be submitted by the due date. Late exams are not accepted.

Although I encourage you to strive to meet all due dates, I will accept late weekly assignments (vocabulary quizzes, chapter assignments, internet exercises, and chapter quizzes) for partial credit under the following circumstances:

- A 1% per day penalty is automatically applied to late submissions.
- The work is submitted before the exam associated with the material. For example, to receive credit for assignments from weeks 1, 2, 3, and 4 the work must be submitted before the Exam 1 due date.

Late work will not be accepted after each respective exam due date.

Academic integrity:

Academic integrity is expected on all course assignments and activities. Plagiarism, cheating and/or fabrication or falsification of research on any assignment, project, paper or exam will absolutely not be tolerated.
