Course Description

Students continue to develop composition skills to prepare for professional writing in technical and scientific fields, and contextualizing assignments in the workplace. Students practice writing and revision processes to produce diverse workplace documents, collaborate with peers, and adapt rhetorical strategies to cultural, social, and political contexts. May be taught with a CEL component.

Credit Hours: 3

Prerequisite: ENGL 1010 with a C- or better or passing ENGL 1010 CLEP Test

Course Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

1. Analyze professional writing production and distribution practices.
2. Explain the centrality of audience and context to workplace writing.
3. Evaluate the effectiveness of workplace writing documents.
4. Produce at least three technical documents commonly used in workplaces.

5. Adapt composing choices for different workplace purposes, audiences, and contexts.
6. Demonstrate proficiency in ethically citing information in professional writing.
7. Self-assess the effectiveness of composing choices based on purpose, audience, and context.

Course Requirements

1. Attendance and Participation

Active participation is essential for both online and in-person meetings. In-person attendance is part of the final grade in hybrid and face-to-face sections.

2. Assignments

Assignments fall under four modules:

- *Module 1: Introduction to Technical Communication (10%)*
- *Module 2: Writing Project (40%) – focuses on text-based professional writing skills*
- *Module 3: Design Project (40%) – explores visual/multimedia design and presentation*
- *Module 4: Professional Portfolio (10%) – includes creating a professional portfolio*

3. Reading and Quizzes

Regular quizzes on module readings ensure understanding and retention of material.

4. ePortfolio Submission

The course includes a "Signature Assignment" for SLCC's General Education ePortfolio, with a reflection component assessing personal growth.
