Course Description

Beginning Sewing students will achieve a basic level of sewing skills and an understanding of beginner level appropriate techniques. Each sewing technique will be completed in a sample form. Application of certain basic skills will be reinforced through three sewing projects - the projects will be graded according to application of the specific techniques taught in the class, the textbook, and other materials.

Semester(s): All

Beginning Sewing students will achieve a basic level of sewing skills and an understanding of level appropriate techniques. Each sewing technique will be completed in a sample form. Application of some basic skills will be reinforced through two sewing projects: a basic pencil skirt and a "pajama" pant. The projects will be graded according to the specific techniques taught in the class and the textbook. A mini-Sheath dress will also be constructed for the practical portion of the final.

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Correctly and effectively demonstrate the ability to properly use basic sewing terms and vocabulary used in commercial pattern directions.
- Demonstrate the ability to correctly interpret directions on a pattern envelope and evaluate the items needed to successfully complete the project.
- Demonstrate proficiency at analyzing and choosing the best sewing technique(s) for garment assembly that would best produce the most professional outcome.
- Correctly identify the direction of fabric grain and correctly articulate the reasons pattern pieces are placed and cut in the desired direction.
- Demonstrate the ability correctly measure and sew appropriate seam allowances and proficiency at choosing the seam finish most appropriate for the fabric and seam application.
- Demonstrate the ability to both correctly identify and apply commonly used seams in apparel design.
- Demonstrate proficiency in sewing two basic hand-sewn stitches that, when necessary, are used in the completion of certain garments.
- Demonstrate the ability to create garments that highlight the techniques and concepts learned.
- Demonstrate proficiency at self-evaluation to evaluate whether a garment was made to the best of the student's ability and reflects their knowledge and understanding of the sewing techniques and concepts learned in this course.

Keys for Success (how to succeed in the course)

Cut sample fabric out at home, so you are ready to sew at the school

A demonstration of the sample will be given at the beginning of class. Time will be given in class to practice sewing the technique and prepare a sample(s). Cutting of sample fabric MUST be done at home so student can utilize the time in class to sew ask questions if needed and become familiar with the technique being taught. There is not enough table space in the class room for students to cut fabric in class.

Be sure you bring sewing supplies, muslin, fashion fabric, contrasting thread and the correct interfacing to EVERY class period.

Even though you have already cut your sample(s), you may need extra fabric to remake your sample if needed and time permits.

it is also the instructors perogatve to change, redo or have the students add more samples to the tecnique be learned. Having your supplies at every class period is a for the best success.

Reading

A reading assignment will be given for almost every class period. Required reading will help

prepare and familiarize the student for what will be taught in the next class. Test and quiz

questions will come from the reading assignment and the class lectures.

Attendance

Students will learn a new technique or skill EVERY class period. Instructions and techniques for the samples and projects will be taught at the beginning of the class period. Being late or absent to class will put the student behind.

Don't get behind!

As each assignment builds on the last one, missing class and falling behind, it is very difficult to catch up on assignments.

Brief Description of Assignments/Exams

Samples/homework

Samples are required to show there is a sufficient understanding of the sewing technique. A demonstration of the sample will be given at the beginning of class and then time will be given to practice the sewing technique and prepare the sample(s).

Samples may require several hours per week at home to perfect. Students are encouraged to practice on samples until they are correct. Sewing 6 or 8 or even 10 samples may be required until student feels comfortable showing a working knowledge of that technique.

SEWING TAKES PRACTICE! It is recommended to remake every sample until a professional look is achieved. Don't settle for turning in samples you know you could make better!

All sample fabric is to be cut out at home as homework and ready the class period it is going to be sewn.

Grading Scale

Grading

Individual sample grading Rubrics* will be handed out when the technique for each sample is taught.

*Definition: Rubric – a guide listing specific criteria for grading or scoring academic papers, projects, or tests

Grading rubrics have the steps of the techniques listed so students will know what is required of each sample/project. Rubrics tell how well the technique was executed: what the student has mastered and what still "needs work".

Students will grade themselves BEFORE turning in their homework, using the rubric. The instructor will also grade the sample. Being self-aware in sewing is key to becoming a fantastic sewer.

Samples will vary in their point value depending on how difficult it is and how many steps are required to complete the sample.

After samples are graded, they should be added to your Sample Book.

Weekly sample assignments that are not turned in when due will automatically have a point loss.

Quizzes

Daily quizzes will be given at the beginning of most every class period. Quiz questions will be taken from the previous lectures/videos and the required reading. Being prepared with all your sewing supplies and having samples cut, ready to sew for that class period, may also count as a quiz. This is a way for the instructor to know if the student is prepared and understands the information and techniques being taught. It also

encourages the student to retain what is being taught, so they are ready to add on and learn the next steps. Remember, sewing is foundational and what is learned in the earlier class periods will be needed to continue to learn new techniques. Quizzes are given the first 15 minuets of class. They can NOT be made up if late or missed.
