Course Description

Intermediate sewing builds on the basic skills and techniques that students acquire in FASH 1500 - Beginning Sewing, and emphasizes industry sewing techniques using industrial machines. Additionally, specialized hand sewing techniques are covered. Sewing techniques will be practiced using sample garments and practical application of these skills will be assessed and graded in four sewing projects.

Pre-Requisite(s): FASH 1500 with a C grade or higher

- Demonstrate proficiency at properly preparing fabric for cutting, marking, and fitting.
- Correctly interpret garment construction terminology and follow pattern instruction and layout diagrams.
- Demonstrate proficiency in using intermediate construction techniques to produce samples and garments that meet current industry quality standards.
- Proficiently operate both a domestic / dressmaker's machine, and industrial sewing machine.
- Proficiently cut, sew and complete course apparel projects to meet current industry ready-to-wear quality standards.

Keys for Success (how to succeed in the course)

Students are strongly encouraged to attend class since attendance and participation account for a significant part of the grade. Class will begin promptly. Students must be present for the 2 hours and twenty minutes of class to get full attendance point credit. This applies to classes on both Monday's and Wednesday's. One day of attendance will

be dropped from grading points. Points for attendance will decrease 1 point every 5 minutes you are late. Importance of attendance cannot be stressed enough because vital techniques are taught at the beginning of every class and will not be replicated for those who choose not to show up. These techniques must be sewn in the samples and projects as demonstrated in class. Those who miss class should not expect to get a good grade. There is a direct correlation between attendance percentage and grade performance in class.

Absences of three or more classes in one semester will result in a failing grade. NOTE: 3 Lates = 1 Absence, 9 Lates = Failing grade. If there is an extenuating circumstance, please let the instructor know at least 12 hours before class by email so arrangements can be made.

Students should expect to perform at least six hours per week preparing and completing tasks for this class. Your skills should be on the advanced level to prevent spending an inordinate amount time on any project or assignment. This class relies heavily on construction quality. It is absolutely important to be present and learn each of the scheduled techniques each week. Being on time for the demonstrations, reviewing Canvas helps and putting in the time to better your skills is essential to our class.

Brief Description of Assignments/Exams

COURSE REQUIREMENTS: Homework AssignmentsCompleting the samples proficiently is considered the minimum requirement demonstrating a sufficient understanding of the material. Students are encouraged to practice on samples until they are correct. Samples will be turned in the week following the class where they were demonstrated and will constitute 25% of the final grade. Sample homework assignments are the foundation from which students will construct final projects; the more skilled

students become completing sample homework assignments, the better prepared students will be in putting together final projects. A student that comes better prepared to class will achieve the maximum amount of success in class.

3" Binder – Sample ProjectsStudents will be required to keep all sample assignments mounted on one side of card stock pages. Card stock pages are to be inserted into sheet protectors and added to binder by subject. The Sample pages will constitute 25% of the final grade

Projects- Each student is required to complete four projects: A sleeveless basic shell, a blouse, and two tailored shirts. One tailored shirt will be sewn in class and the second outside class. The projects will be graded according to your mastery of the specific techniques taught in the class, the textbook, and other materials. Projects will constitute 40% of your final grade. Late projects will not be accepted.
