Course Description

This is the first in a series of two capstone courses where students will develop an individual collection for our fashion show. Students will develop and present design ideas, source materials, refine patterning skills, and perfect muslin samples. Students will demonstrate advanced level fashion design skills through the conception, development and execution of their collection.

Pre-Requisite(s): FASH 1210, FASH 1505, and FASH 2150 (2150 may be taken concurrently)

Semester(s): Fall

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Demonstrate the ability to conceptualize a line of ten unique looks.
- Demonstrate the ability to correctly apply drafting, draping and construction techniques to the construction of all garments.
- Demonstrate the ability to articulate design concepts verbally and visually using industry specific terms and jargon.
- Demonstrate the ability to make appropriate fabric choices for specific designs in regard to fabric properties.
- Demonstrate an ability to develop, refine and integrate a personal design aesthetic into creative, functional designs.
- Demonstrate the ability to accurately translate design ideas into functional patterns, samples and finished garments.
