PREREQUISITES: FASH 2410

COURSE DESCRIPTION: Designed for second year students, this is the second in a series of two capstone courses, focused on producing a collection for our fashion show. Students learn to perfect muslin samples, construct garments, and fit finished garments on models. Students will demonstrate advanced level fashion design and construction skills through the conception, development and execution of their collection.

What Will Be Covered:

- ✓ Concept and development of a cohesive collection of ten garments.
- ✓ Implementation of the design principles.
- ✓ Design presentations: inspiration, and illustrations, including flats & swatches
- ✓ Pattern-making and construction techniques
- ✓ Oral presentation of these ideas to the class for feedback

COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

CAMERA

You need to document your process for your Design Journal. (your phone will work just fine)

HOMEWORK

At least 6 hours per week outside of class. You should be prepared to spend time outside of the class reading/finishing your assignments to be prepared for the next class.

MISSING CLASS

When you miss class, it is your responsibility to get information missed. The instructor will not repeat information. You should exchange information with two (2) of your classmates.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance is mandatory. If you need to miss class for an unavoidable reason, you need to let me know ahead of time. If you're tardy it is your responsibility to inform me. If you don't, you risk losing all attendance points. Make sure you witness the marking of your tardy in the grade-book. No changes will be made at the end of the semester. I expect all students to be prepared to work in class and stay the full class period.

<u>FIT</u>

You will also be graded on the proper fit of your looks. Make sure that you or your model brings the undergarments they will be wearing with the garment to each fitting: bra, spanx, shoes and petticoat or whatever else that will affect the fit & silhouette of garment. You will schedule your own fittings. There will not be a mass fitting. You will get 2 fittings. Make sure you take pictures of your final fitting for you and your dresser.

CONSTRUCTION

Time & effort should be evident in your work. Sloppy work will not receive full credit. The inside should be as beautiful as the outside. Stitches should be consistent in length. There should be between 15 &17 stitches per inch. Stitches should have proper tension. Your garment should be free of wrinkles.

ILLUSTRATION AND FLATS

The fit & design of your garment should be clear.

EPORTFOLIO

Choose an assignment that demonstrates your best work from the semester. Take a photo and upload it into your ePortfolio. Write a paragraph, reflecting on your process:

- 1. What was the assignment you chose for your eportfolio project?
- 2. Why did you choose this project?
- 3. What did you learn from completing this project?
- 4. How do you see yourself using these skills and experiences in the future?

DESIGN JOURNAL

Keep all of your ideas here. Document your process.

STUDENT FASHION SHOW ELIGIBILITY

- you must execute & complete 10 looks (but need to show at least 7)
- you must successfully complete FASH 2410: Concepts and Muslin Prototypes
- you must successfully complete FASH 2440: Final Fabrication
- you must perform & complete all work: you may not employ anyone, paid or unpaid
- you must design & construct looks that are tasteful & respectful to your audience
- you must acquire instructor approval
- you must provide your own fit models.


