

Course Description

Studies the growth and development of adolescents. Principles and issues that affect adolescents' daily lives in the home, school, and society are discussed.

- Engage in reflective thinking and expression through a series of written assignments and make connections between adolescence and all of human development.
- Participate in several field experience observations of adolescents in a variety of settings.


How to Succeed in the Course

Coursework & Assignment Descriptions

Assignments (30% of your final grade)

Written assignments are an essential component of your learning experience and provide an opportunity for you to critically analyze theory and practice. Each assignment will give you several topics to choose from. Instructions and topics are posted on each chapter's assignment page.

You are not required to do a written essay assignment for each chapter, but one essay of the options for every other chapter. For example, choose one option from Chapters 1 & 2.

In order to receive full credit, assignments must be submitted on time, be typed using standard 1" margins and 12 pt. Times New Roman font, and written in a professional manner. Each assignment topic must fully address key components of the question or scenario, and the Answer section of your essay must be 500 words in length. Assignments are graded on a ten-point scale. Follow the course calendar for due dates. COMPUTER ISSUES ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE REASONS FOR LATE WORK!!

Quizzes (30% of your final grade)

A series of brief multiple-choice, true/false, and essay tests will serve to assess your learning in this course as well as deepen your understanding of adolescent growth and development. All tests are taken online; test dates are listed on the course calendar. Tests are open for a week prior to the due date.

The first four chapter quizzes will be open-book quizzes, so you can get a feel for the software and the class. For the open-book quizzes, you may use your book, your notes, and any other resource except another person. The remaining quizzes will be closed-book quizzes, where you may not use any resource (other than your memory).

Quizzes will require the LockDown Browser software. Instructions for downloading/installing the software are posted on the Technology and Software page in the Getting Started section of Canvas. The software allows you to take quizzes offcampus and uses your device's webcam and microphone to proctor your quizzes, which can then be reviewed by your professor. Like Canvas, the LockDown Browser complies with federal privacy laws to protect your information. IMPORTANT: Please take note of the following:

- Equipment: If you do not have the necessary equipment to use the LockDown Browser, you must notify me within the first week of class to make other arrangements.
- Ebooks: If you are using an ebook for the class, you will need to use TWO devices for open-book quizzes: one device to take the quiz with the LockDown Browser and a separate device to access the ebook. For example, you could take the quiz on a laptop and access the ebook on your phone.

Discussions (15% of your final grade)

Each week students will participate in a discussion based on course material. Weekly discussion points will focus on child growth and development, specific theories, and controversial subjects. To enhance your learning and professional growth, it is important to read other students' responses. You may submit comments to peer responses as well. IN ORDER TO RECEIVE ALL 3 POINTS for the discussion, you must post your discussion comment and also comment on the posts of two other class members.

Class Project (25% of your final grade)

Students will participate in a research project to provide a deeper understanding of historical frameworks, topic definitions, and critical analysis of issues in the field of adolescent development. A key element of research is sharing findings with others. The research project is your choice of two options: a formal paper OR a presentation. Additional information is available on the assignment page. The project grading page will look like you need to do both options, but when you complete the research paper OR the podcast, I will "excuse" the other.
