Course Description

This course will present the principles of transportation and supply chain management. The key activities of supply chain as well as the inflow, outflow, warehousing and their roles in the physical distribution process will be presented.

Semester(s): Fall & Spring

This course is designed to give the student a basic knowledge of supply chain management, logistics, and operations management. The hope is to prepare the student to be able to function well in an entry-level SCM position. We will be covering SCM fundamental, product and process design, customer relationship management, sourcing and supplier management, inventory management, sale, and operations management, logistics, project management, lean and six sigma management.

Since most of these topics have whole courses devoted to them, we will only be giving you a working knowledge base, a foundation. As you go through the course I would encourage you to take note of topics that you especially enjoy. Then, once you get into your upper-division coursework, you can continue to study those subjects in-depth.

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Explain the fundamentals of transportation and how they relate to the economy through quizzes, study guide questions, discussions, and papers.
- Communicate effectively orally and in writing according to the standard usage.
- Demonstrate the ability to write effective college-level papers.
- Demonstrate through team projects the ability to collaborate with peers.
- Analyze the functions associated with physical distribution and supply chains and evaluate trends in supply chains through quizzes, study guide questions, discussions, and papers.

- Read selected articles and demonstrate an ability to evaluate, analyze, and comment on those articles.
- Thinking critically in writing and orally in discussions.
- Explain environmental impacts of supply chain globalization and transportation.
- Explain from the supply chain/logistics perspective.
- Explain the current trends in supply chain management.
- Synthesize the major activities of Supply chain management and logistics.

Communication Plan
