Course Description

A course to broaden the music majors vision of performance: staging, interpretation, execution and removing barrier between performer and audience. Major attend departmental recitals and concerts.

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Students will demonstrate a professional music vocabulary in the analysis of live music department recitals and concerts.

Communication Plan

Keys for Success (how to succeed in the course)

In an effort to align the concert attendance requirement with all other colleges in the Utah System of Higher Education and nationwide we are requiring 12 concerts in a semester. Remember that you need 4 concert attendance credits to graduate in music. In a 15-week semester at all other USHE institutions the requirement is 12 concerts. Remember that this is a requirement that articulates and is required everywhere in the state and across the nation.

1. 12 concerts are required.
2. Of the 12 concerts 7 must be SLCC music department events. We will also accept concerts when you are performing.
3. The other 5 concerts may be of your choosing with professional and semi-professional ensembles of all music genres. Musical theater is accepted IF, and only IF, the accompaniment is live. We will accept attending one rehearsal of an ensemble that you are not part of.

4. You may use online, live-streamed concerts if it is approved in writing by one of the instructors *in advance*. We will provide approval for the following reasons: there are health or scheduling difficulties that prevent you from attending live concerts, or you wish to see a live-streamed concert in a style or genre of music that is not available in a local concert. If the live-streamed concert does not solve one of these two problems, it will not be approved.
5. Submit your 3 sentence reviews *with* the ticket, program or a picture from the concert in Canvas on site for credit. You must submit your concert within two weeks.

You get your credit when you turn in and we approve 12 submissions.

It is that easy.

Brief Description of Assignments/Exams

To get credit for attending a concert:

1. Take a photo of your event ticket or program or scan it to your computer (see instructions below to upload your media file)
2. Write a short report on the event you attended. To do this you have two options for submission, chose one below:

Option 1- Submit your report: Submit using the Upload feature.

- a. Click on Submit Assignment in the upper, right portion of the assignment screen.
- b. Click on the File Upload tab.
- c. Use the search tool available to find your report file on your computer.
- d. Click on the file name to attach the file to the upload tool.
- e. Click Submit Assignment to submit for grading.

Option 2-Submit your report: Submit using the Text Entry box to type directly into the Text Entry tool, or cut and paste content from a Word file into the Text Entry Box.

- a. Click on Submit Assignment in the upper, right portion of the assignment screen.
- b. Click on the Text Entry Tab.
- c. Type of cut and paste content into the Text Entry window.
- d. Click Submit Assignment a second time-to submit your assignment for grading.

To Submit your Program or Ticket Photo:

- a. Click on Submit Assignment in the upper, right portion of the assignment screen.
- b. Click on Media Recording tab.
- c. Click on upload media recording.
- d. Search your saved photo file by using the search option.
- e. Click on the file name to connect the file
- f. Click on Submit Assignment again to submit file for grading.

Remember that you must submit within two weeks of the concert.

Grading Scale

Those who successfully complete all 12 concert attendance assignments receive a passing grade. Failure to do so in a semester means that you do not receive credit for completing the course this semester. You must receive four passing grades in this course in order to graduate with a degree in music from SLCC.
