## **Course Description and Content**

#### **Course Description**

Sight Singing is an essential skill for musicians. The ability to "hear" the music, or audiate, before performing helps you succeed in performing, practicing, studio sessions, and collaboration.

This class is the third semester of a four-semester series. Continued development of aural skills, building on those learned in SS-ET I & II.

Music majors *must* take this course together with Music Theory III (MUSC 2110).

Prerequisite: MUSC 1140.

#### **Course Content**


Areas of emphasis this semester include:

- Quintuple meters
- Decorative chromaticism
- Inflected scale degrees
- Scalar variants
- Modal borrowing
- Secondary (applied) dominants
- Modulations
  - To closely related keys
  - To distantly related keys
- Neapolitan sixth chords (N6 or bll6)
- Augmented sixth chords (lt6+, Fr6+, and Ger6+)
- Chromaticism implying altered chords

## **Course Objectives**

After successful completion of this course, students will:

- *Sing* diatonic and chromatic melodies at sight
  - Using appropriate solfège syllables with fixed and movable do
- Perform simple and complex rhythms
- Use elements learned in Sight Singing/Ear Training I and II
- Take melodic, rhythmic, and harmonic dictation

#### Skill Building

The class sessions are the main source for learning for the course. However, you cannot develop these skills with just the in-class exercises.

You must also spend time each day outside of class practicing your sight singing and dictation skills.

Expect an assignment to practice your sight singing and dictation

skills outside of class time every day.

Please arrive to class on time and plan to stay for the entire session.

#### Each Class Session

Each class session is the main source for learning for the course. Please arrive to class on time and plan to stay for the entire session.

There will be weekly activities throughout the semester that are designed to give you opportunities to apply the connecters we are learning.

Activities include: quizzes, time at the whiteboard, singing in small groups, and leading musical excerpts.

#### **Sight Singing Preparation**

#### **Each Class Session**

EACH CLASS: Each class consists

of sight singing and dictation. Sight singing exercises from the Music for Sight Singing textbook are assigned in the modules.

You may be asked to sing aloud by yourself or with 1-2 classmates as part of class activities.

# OUTSIDE OF CLASS: You should not play the sight singing exercises an instrument.

- You may use a keyboard (or other instrument) to give yourself a starting pitch or to check your pitch.
- Try to figure out the melodies by yourself without hearing them. This will help you on your sight singing exams.
- Use appropriate solfège symbols; hand signs are not required.
- Use movable do as well as fixed do.
- Use 'rhythmic' sight singing (taka-di-mi, et al.).

#### **Participation**

#### **Ear Training Dictation Practice**

#### **Each Class Session**

Each class consists of harmonic, melodic, and rhythmic dictation. These practice sessions are essential for musicianship skills.

You will work alone, with classmates, and at the whiteboard. These opportunities are for your benefit and I totally understand if it is not 'your thing' to be up in front of people. I will work with you to help you make it a more comfortable experience.

#### **OUTSIDE OF CLASS**

Spend time outside of class to learn quality dictation skills on *Auralia* as well as on your own.

Homework assignments on Auralia include quizzes in rhythmic, melodic, and harmonic dictation.

#### **Assessment**

There are five (5) sight singing checkpoints during the semester. These occur at the end of each unit in the *Music for Sight Singing* book.

You will be given a melody to sing and will have a. Maximum of four (4) minutes to prepare the melody before singing it for a grade.

The lowest checkpoint score will be dropped from the final grade.

Ear Training Checkpoints (Dictation) (30 % of Grade)

5 (five) During the Semester 1 (one) final Dictation Exam

There are five (5) dictation quizzes in class during the semester. These occur at the end of each unit in the *Music for Sight Singing* book.


