Intro to Clinical Judgement

NRSG1105 001

Course Description

- NRSG 1105, Introduction to clinical Judgement, provides students with the knowledge and practical application of basic nursing skills, through simulated scenarios and clinical based situations that correspond to health alterations learned in NRSG 1100 and NRSG 1110, such as patient centered-care, teamwork, safety, documentation, nursing process, therapeutic communication, and clinical judgement.
 - There are seven days that you must attend. If you are unable to attend or are late, you will have to attend the makeup lab. The makeup lab will be announced towards the end of the semester. <u>There will be no other</u> <u>makeup day and it is not guaranteed!</u>
 - Clinicals will be assigned by the SLCC Nursing Department Clinical Coordinator who will provide the clinical schedule to students.

Simulations:

 To Pass this course, you must successfully complete all final skills pass-off, two hands-on simulations (lab day 4 and lab day 5), and an ISPE final simulation. These simulations will represent all learned skills, and student performance will be graded (Primary/ Secondary RN Feedback).

Ticket to lab "entry ticket":

You are required to complete your ticket to lab or entry ticket assignment and bring it to class. This will be an assignment that you have completed online and you will print the submission page (MUST be a HARD copy) a digital version will not be accepted. The assignment will be due in canvas at 2359 (1159) the night prior. If you do provide this in class you may be asked to leave and this will count as an unexcused absence.

Quizzes:

Graded quizzes will be part of required lab assignments and or/ lab packets.
 Each canvas module will have a quiz. There may be the possibility for remediation. Refer to NRSG 1105 canvas page for more information.
 Remediation will only count for those that took the student by the due date.

Skills Pass-Offs:

 Skills Pass-Offs will be randomly drawn by the student at the end of the semester. The student must achieve a 78% or better to pass the course. A 78% or better must be obtained before any other coursework can be factored in. This is considered a proctored test.

Assignments:

Graded Lab module assignments are required for this course. Some
assignments may need to be completed prior to the assed lab day. Refer to
the NRSG 105 Canvas page for dates and assignment details. This is your
ticket to lab and you need to print the submission copy and bring a HARD
copy to class (a digital copy will not be accepted).

Attendance:

- Read the Lab-Clinical Attendance Policy in the Orientation Module.
 IMPORTANT- Clinical and Lab hours are combined and absence from lab and clinicals could result in failure in the course.
 - Unexcused absences are limited to one 4-hour lab and one 12-hour clinical, for a max of 16 hours. All hours will be required to be made up. More than 16 hours will result in a failure of the lab. There is no guarantee that there will be a clinical slot available for the makeup, resulting in a failure of the lab.
 - Excused absences or ADS (Modified attendance)- related absences are limited to two 4-hour lab days and one 12-hour clinical, for a total of 20 hours. All hours will be required to be made up. More than 20 hours will result in a lab failure. There is no guarantee that there will be a clinical slot available for the makeup; it will be addressed on a case-by-case basis and may result in failure or incomplete for the course.

Grading Scale

• Grading Policy:

 A minimum grade of C+ (78%) must be achieved in all didactic nursing courses to be eligible to progress from one semester to the next semester and to graduate from the nursing program.

- A passing grade must be achieved in all clinical nursing courses to be eligible to progress from one semester to the next semester and to graduate from the nursing program.
- Students must achieve a 80.0% average on all proctored exams and proctored quizzes (as designated by instructor) before additional coursework can be factored in.
- Grades are computed following a scale that is approved by Salt Lake Community College.

Students are required to achieve a minimum of 78% (C+) average on all proctored exams and proctored quizzes before additional course work is factored in. Students must ALSO achieve a minimum of 78% (C+) in the overall course. Any student who does not meet these minimum requirements will not be allowed to advance to the following semester courses nor graduate. The student will be required to follow the policy outlined in the Nursing Program handbook which may include repeating the course (on a space available basis), repeating associated course (on a space available basis, or removal from the program.

Incomplete Process

- The nursing department is bound by the SLCC requirements for awarding an incomplete grade for a course. These requirements are as follows:
 - An incomplete can only be considered when the student has unforeseen emergency circumstance that prevent their completion of the course requirements.
 - The student must have completed at lease seventy-five percent (75%) of the course with a form.
 - The plan for completing an incomplete grade must be done within one year,
 or the course grade will become an "E."
