# **Course Description**

Emphasis placed on normal/high-risk pregnancies, growth/development, family dynamics, common pediatric disorders and promotion of healthy behaviors in patients.





- A minimum grade of C+ (78.0%) must be achieved in all didactic nursing courses to be eligible to progress from one semester to the next semester and to graduate from the nursing program.
- A passing grade C+ (78%) must be achieved in all clinical/lab nursing courses to be eligible to progress from one semester to the next semester and to graduate from the nursing program.
- Students must achieve a 78.0% average on all proctored exams and proctored quizzes (as designated by instructor) before additional coursework can be factored

in.

 Grades are computed following a scale that is approved by Salt Lake Community College.

Students must ALSO achieve a minimum of 78% (C+) in the overall course. There is no rounding up of grades. Any student who does not meet these minimum requirements will not be allowed to advance to the following semester courses nor graduate. The student will be required to follow the policy outlined in the Nursing Program handbook which may include repeating the course (on a space available basis), repeating associated course (on a space available basis), or removal from the program.

\*This class is a co-requisite. If a student does not pass NRSG 2315, they will receive no better than a "C" in this course.

# Brief Description of Assignments/Exams

#### Course work:

• Exams: There will be four proctored exams that will be taken in the testing center (please schedule your exam using register blast). An OB midterm (Exam 1) and an OB final (Exam 2). A Peds midterm (Exam 3) and a Peds final (Exam 4). None of the exams will be comprehensive. Each exam will be 50 questions, 2 points per

- question, 100 points each; 400 points total. Exams taken late will be given a 10% reduction in points per day.
- PrepU Quizzes: There will be thirty quizzes, 15 for OB and 15 for Peds. We would like you to achieve a mastery level of 5. They will be pass or fail if you achieve the mastery level by the due date. Each quiz is worth10 points; 300 points total. PrepU Quizzes will be accepted up to 7 days after the due date with a10% reduction in points total.
- In-Class Assignments: Assignments will be completed in class and turned in at the
  end of class. Each assignment is worth 20 points; 200 points total. You can attend
  any of the four weekly class times that works with your schedule even if you're not
  registered for that class time. Assignments will not be accepted after class.

#### **Late Work and Testing:**

Each exam will be open for 3 days. If you need to schedule a make-up time, please reach out to your instructors. There will be a 10% reduction in points each day without an accommodation.

We will allow PrepUs to be turned in up to 7 days after the due date with a 10% deduction.
