Course Description

Students have practical application and active learning in lecture content. Designated as a Community-Engaged Learning course.

Prereq: Acceptance into the OTA program Coreq: OTA 1120 Semester: Fall

Students study manual wheelchair parts/use/design/fit, ADL and IADL techniques & adapted devices; activity analysis; architectural accessibility and universal design; ergonomics; static splints/hand assessments, workplace design and patient cognitive levels. Designated as a community-engaged learning course.

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the structure and function of the human body by correctly fitting adaptive equipment and splints to the human body.
- Articulate and understand the need for and use of compensatory strategies when desired life tasks cannot be performed by selecting and adapting equipment.
- Teach compensatory strategies appropriate for the client.
- Demonstrate the ability to adapt/modify environments and processes and/or use of adaptive equipment to allow meaningful performance of ADL and IADL by a client.
- Demonstrate oral and written communication skills by completing written papers and verbal informal communication in class.

- Demonstrate the ability to educate the client, caregiver, family and significant others to facilitate skills in areas of occupation as well prevention, health maintenance and safety.
- Demonstrate the ability to train/instruct the client, caregiver, family, and significant other in self- care, self- management, health management and maintenance, home management, and community and work integration.
- Demonstrate the ability to effectively provide training in techniques to enhance functional mobility.
- Use measures and angles in the fabrication of static splints.
- Collect data and assess client's performance of ADL's and select appropriate adaptive equipment based on the client's occupational profile.
- Assist with the development of occupation based intervention plans and strategies based on client need and data collected during the evaluation.
- Select and provide direct occupational therapy interventions to enhance performance in ADL's and IADL's by using appropriate activities and training in selfcare, self-management and home management.
- Identify strategies to assist the consumer in gaining access to occupational therapy services.
- Complete rotations for client-centered care in the didactic occupational therapy assistant clinic.
- Exhibit the ability to communicate and collaborate with groups and individuals.
- Explain the role of occupation in the promotion of health and the prevention of disease and disability for the individual, family, and society.
- Demonstrate the ability to utilize word processing for assignments and access course material/grades through Canvas.
