Course Description

This course prepares students for a geri-psych rehab off-site experience along with instruction on preparation for Fieldwork II's. Designated Community-Engaged Learning course.

Prereq: Complete all second semester courses

Semester: Fall

This course prepares students for a Geri-psych rehab off-site experience along with instruction on preparation for fieldwork II's. Designated service-learning course (see below for more details).

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Recognize and abide by facility and federally mandated health care requirements of patient confidentiality and patient rights.
- Observe and participate in the Occupational Therapy (OT) process as it relates to geri-psych and psychosocial evidence based practice.
- Refine clinical observation skills of evidence based practices and practice outcomes.
- Demonstrate service maintenance emphasizing safety for the client and clinician.
- Identify the uniqueness of geri-psych and psychosocial service delivery models in various practice settings such as long and short term inpatient/outpatient/community-based.
- Establish understanding and implementation of models of practice and frames of reference for geri-psych and psychosocial OT practice.

- Demonstrate knowledge of applicable national requirements for credentialing and requirements for licensure, certification, or registration under state laws by completing the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy (NBCOT) assignment.
- Describe the ongoing professional responsibility for providing fieldwork education and the criteria for becoming a fieldwork educator.
- Provide and accept feedback, modifying behavior as needed.
- Communicate and collaborate effectively through verbal, body language, and written responses/documentation with all stakeholders.
- Under the direction of an administrator, manager, or occupational therapist, collect, organize, and report on data for evaluation of client outcomes.
- Identify self as an Occupational Therapy Assistant (OTA) student 100% of the time.
- Consistently use politically correct and people first language in written and oral work.
- Format goals and notes using objective measures in a quantitative format with progression of skill sets readily observable to the reader.
- Integrate classroom knowledge demonstrated by identification of diagnosis, functional deficits, occupational areas, measurability of goals, treatment techniques, and client response to intervention.
- Analyze information to present in oral and/or written formats.
- Engage and participate in a community based outpatient clinic to enhance the academic experience.
- Complete a service learning project for facility/client use.
- Interact with various stakeholders in a professional and ethical manner.
- Facilitate discharge planning by reviewing the needs of the client and other stakeholders; available resource; and discharge environment, and identify those needs to the OT, client and other stakeholders involved in discharge planning.
- Participate in the service delivery process of OTA clinic clients.
- Use technology and information literacy to access course materials and complete assignments.
