# **Course Description**

Explore the field of psychology in this introductory survey of psychology's scientific study of mind and behavior.

# **Course Learning Outcomes**

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. Identify and describe introductory psychological concepts.
- 2. Apply psychology to aspects of life such as personal growth, everyday life, or the college experience.

- 3. Identify and evaluate different research strategies used in psychology including ethical concerns.
- 4. Evaluate, design, or conduct psychological research.

# **Course Requirements**

### 1. Weekly Quizzes

Each week, students complete quizzes that assess understanding of key concepts from the readings and lectures. Quizzes are designed to reinforce learning and provide immediate feedback.

#### 2. Discussion Participation

Discussions are a mix of structured topics and open forums for peer interaction. Participation in these discussions allows students to engage actively with course content, applying theoretical concepts to real-world scenarios.

#### 3. Study Plans

Study Plans in the Lumen One system provide readings, practice questions, and selfchecks to build foundational knowledge in psychology. Completing these plans is crucial for preparing for quizzes and exams.

### 4. Exams

Two main exams (Midterm and Final) evaluate cumulative knowledge. The exams may include multiple-choice, short-answer, and essay questions covering major topics from the course.

### 5. Final Project or Research Paper

Depending on the section, the course concludes with a final project or a research paper where students demonstrate the application of psychological principles. Topics are often chosen in consultation with the instructor.
