Course Description

- Interpret special considerations and demonstrate skills of healthcare professionals as they relate to pediatrics and geriatrics.

A disposable lab coat may be provided for use over street clothes if scrubs are not worn for lab and clinical skills. Closed-toe shoes are also required in the laboratory/clinical setting areas when practicing skills.

There will be no food or drinks allowed in the computer or lab area of the classroom. A 'Break Room' with a microwave and refrigerator is available for student use.

Cellular Phone Usage:

Cellular phones will be turned to silent mode, or if they do not have a silent option, they will be turned off while in the classroom. Any phone conversation must be made outside the classroom to avoid disrupting others. Phones are not allowed at the testing stations.

An emergency guideline and evacuation route are posted in the classroom. As you progress through the program, you will learn OSHA safety standards in a medical setting. There is a binder with Material Safety Data Sheets located in the classroom to use as a reference for an incident involving hazardous materials.
