# Financial Accounting I

## Course Description

Financial Accounting I covers the basic structure of accounting. Understanding asset, liability, equity, revenue, and expense accounts for service and merchandising companies. The accounting cycle including cash, inventory, receivables, and payables are also covered.

## Brief Description of Assignments/Exams

#### Homework

Practicing the art and skill of accounting is critical for success; therefore, foundation assignments are an integral part of the learning process. You have **three (3) check answers for each part of each problem** to help you with the learning process. Keeping up in this course is critical for success, refer to the course calendar. However, **late homework is accepted, without a late penalty, up until Reading Day!** 

### **Term Project**

You **MUST** do your own work on the Accounting Cycle Problem (no collaboration). This assignment is worth a lot of points - so not one to be "blown off." It can be submitted late - with a 10% late penalty - but only for two (2) weeks past the original due date.

#### Quizzes

You MUST do your own work on the Chapter Mastery Quizzes! Chapter quizzes are untimed and open book/open notes to allow time to work carefully and refer to your textbook and notes. This is the time to do your best work. Because this is a quiz, you only have 1 Final Answer submission. Quizzes are due by 11:59 pm on the date assigned on the course calendar. However, late quizzes are accepted, without a late penalty, up until Reading Day! Also, your lowest quiz score will be dropped. Students are expected to work independently while taking quizzes and comply with all aspects of the Student Code of Conduct. Academic dishonesty will be dealt with according the SLCC Student Code of Conduct.

#### **Tests**

All tests are timed. This is to encourage students to study for the test instead of relying on looking up all the answers. However, students that are adequately prepared should not run out of time on the tests. Just completing the coursework is NOT enough to prepare for the tests. Your reference materials (textbook and notes) should be well organized to be used efficiently during the tests. Students have the option to take each test a second time by Reading Day, if their first attempt is submitted by the original due date. The higher score of the two attempts will be calculated into the grade book. NO tests are dropped.

Don't cheat the learning process during these interim tests because the Final Exam is an in-person and proctored exam.

#### Final Exam

- The Final Exam is an in-person and proctored exam, NOT in MyAccountingLab, and will be taken at the SLCC Testing Center (or proctored through arrangements with the SLCC Testing Center). If you need proctoring arrangements get with them immediately.
- The departmental Final Exam is a pencil-and-paper comprehensive exam, which
  includes both multiple choice questions and working problems, with a time limit of
  two (2) hours. A calculator is allowed (but cannot be a cell phone, iPod, or any
  device capable of accessing the internet).
- ONE 8 ½" X 11" sheet of paper (front and back) of original (NO portion may be a copy including a copy of handwritten notes) handwritten notes may be referenced during the Final Exam. Students that do not comply with the note sheet rules will receive a "0" score for the test.
