# Survey of Financial Accounting

ACCT - 2010 504

### Course Description

A broad view of accounting's role in providing information to external users of financial information. Topics include concepts and methods used in preparing the four basic financial statements from a corporate perspective. In addition to the accounting cycle, this course covers accounting for various current and long-term assets, current and long-term liabilities, and stockholders' equity.

- Explain and apply introductory accounting principles.
- Record and post business transactions, adjusting entries, and closing entries.
- Prepare financial statements from given information.

- Prepare and use a bank reconciliation.
- Account for receivables, including calculating uncollectible amounts and interest.
- Account for inventory, including determining the cost of ending inventory and cost of goods sold under various methods.
- Account for fixed assets, including determining the cost of an asset and calculate depreciation using various methods.

- Account for current and contingent liabilities and explain the basics of bonds payable.
- Account for stock-related transactions, including dividends.
- Prepare the statement of cash flows using the indirect method.
- Calculate and interpret various financial statement ratios.

### Course Prerequisites

This course has no pre-requisites.

### Engagement Plan

Each chapter contains a class discussion assignment. These assignments will give you the opportunity to interact with one of the topics of the chapter and interact with your classmates and instructor.

Announcements are interactive and may include questions to the class. Students are encouraged to respond to the questions or the announcement topic(s).

I will respond to emails, phone calls, and Canvas Inbox messages within about 24 hours of receiving them. Over the weekend my response time may be a little longer.

Assignments completed in MyLab will include immediate score feedback. Problem-specific feedback for quizzes and exams is available after the due date. I will offer feedback on other assignments as soon as possible with a goal of within one week of the due date.

### Brief Description of Assignments/Exams

This course utilizes various procedures and learning experiences including independent reading, video lectures of text concepts, practice exercises, discussion questions, homework assignments, quizzes and exams. This course will utilize Pearson's MyLab Accounting (MyLab or MAL) for most practice, homework, and quiz assignments, along with practice exams and interim exams. Active participation is essential for student success in this course.

#### **Practice Assignments:**

Practicing concepts is an important part of learning accounting. Each chapter module contains videos for students to watch (in lieu of live lectures) and a practice assignment in MyLab. These assignments, due as scheduled, contain a variety of short answer, calculation, and fill in the blank questions, while giving you a chance to work through the concepts with only a minimal impact to your overall grade.

#### Homework:

Homework assignments are an integral part of the learning process for accounting. Homework problems are assigned for each chapter and are due as scheduled. Homework assignments, located in MyLab and linked in Canvas, contain a variety of short answer, calculation, and fill in the blank questions. Homework assignments include one problem to be completed using Excel.

#### **Quizzes:**

Chapter quizzes, one try each, are multiple-choice assignments that are due as scheduled, and are located in MyLab and linked in Canvas. They serve as an indicator to tell you what concepts you understand and what concepts you need to spend more time on. Students are expected to work independently while taking quizzes. You will be able to review your quiz after the due date of the quiz.

#### Exams:

All interim exams are given online in MyLab (and are linked in Canvas). Interim exams are comprised of multiple-choice questions and a handful of homework-style questions. Interim exams will be taken after every 2 to 3 chapters. Interim exams, with two tries each, have the largest impact on your grade. Study hard and make sure you are prepared before you take an exam. Notes and the textbook may be referenced during each interim exam. You will be able to review your exam after the due date of the exam.

#### **Final Exam:**

The departmental final exam is a Canvas-based, multiple choice comprehensive exam with a time limit of 2 hours. ONE 8  $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 11" sheet of paper (front and back) of original handwritten notes may be referenced during the final exam. A calculator is allowed, but may not be a cell phone, tablet, iPod, iPad, etc.

The final exam will be taken in the testing center or with an approved proctor. See the Final Exam Details page for further information.

Keys for Success (how to succeed in the course)

Accounting is not an easy topic for most students and one that is almost impossible to cram for. If you wait until the due date to start this work, you will quickly become frustrated and run out of time. Getting behind on course assignments is not advisable.

Each week, spend the time necessary to learn/practice/understand the course concepts and complete the assignments. As a 3 credit class, you should expect to spend about 9 hours per week on the course, for a full 16-week semester class. That being said, remember that some students will get through the materials more quickly and others will need more time.

### Online Tutoring

Students at SLCC have access to online tutoring through Canvas. From your Canvas course click Online Tutoring in the course navigation and follow the steps to set up an appointment. If this is your first time using the Online Tutoring we recommend you click "Take a Tour" to familiarize yourself with the service.

MyLab Accounting contains the following resources for students.

- Help Me Solve This (HMST). (Available for most homework questions.)

  When you click on the HMST link from within a homework problem, a similar problem to the one you are working on will open. It will provide some hints that the regular problem does not. You can skip ahead to the specific part you are stuck on. You can even skip past it if you'd like to see the correct answer and format for the help problem. Finally you can submit your work and see if you got it right or wrong without affecting your grade. Once you feel confident that you know how to solve the problem, close it and you will return to the problem you were working.
- **Ask My Instructor (AMI).** By clicking the AMI link, when available, you can ask your instructor a question. Your instructor will receive an email with a link to view exactly

what part you are stuck on. This is helpful and convenient for all. Watch your SLCC email account for your instructor's response email.

- **The Study Plan** is where you can find additional questions, similar to the back of each chapter, for practice.
- The **Multimedia Library** is where you'll find publisher videos, demo docs (where you can watch a problem being solved), flashcards, the multimedia textbook, etc. You are encouraged to give the resources a try to see what works with your learning style. You'll find all of these resources linked from the MyLab Accounting Student Links in Modules.

All assignments, with the exception of the final exam, must be completed and submitted by Sunday, December 14th.

Students tend to be more successful when they stay current on the course assignments. To encourage relatively timely submission of assignments, late work is allowed as follows:

- Chapter Notes are due on the Thursday nights and may be submitted late only through the following Monday night. Notes beyond Monday will not be accepted. This policy encourages you to stay current with the course assignments.
- Discussions are due on Thursday nights and may be submitted late only through the following Monday night. This policy also encourages you to stay current with the course assignments.
- Chapter practice assignments are open and available through the due date of the exam (the first attempt) those chapters are related to. There are no penalties for late practice assignments.
- Practice exams are open and available through the end of the semester. There are no penalties for late practice exams.
- Homework assignments are open and available through the due date of the exam
   (the first attempt) those chapters are related to. Due dates are assigned to keep you
   on track to complete the semester on time. There are no penalties for late homework
   assignments.
- Quizzes are open and available through the due date of the exam (the first attempt) those chapters are related to. There are no penalties for late quizzes.

• Exams are only open through their respective due date and may not be taken late. Two attempts are allowed for each of the interim exams. If the first attempt is missed, for whatever reason, then the student may only complete the second attempt, which is due two weeks beyond the due date of the first attempt.
