

Payroll Accounting

ACCT - 2100 501

Course Description

Covers the changing, detailed nature of payroll accounting involving legal challenges, economic changes, technological advances and governmental obligations. Cybersecurity, payroll fraud, labor planning, and labor costs are also covered.

Pre-Requisite(s): CSIS 2010 (may be taken concurrently) and ACCT 1110 or ACCT 1250 or ACCT 2010 or ACCT 2600

Semester(s) Taught: Fall, Spring, Summer

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Identify legislation that pertains to payroll and business. Identify ethical guidelines for payroll accounting.
- Identify payroll procedures and pay cycles. Prepare required employee documentation.
- Compute gross pay for employees. Create a payroll register.
- Compute fringe benefits and voluntary payroll deductions. Compute employee net pay.
- Calculate federal and state payroll taxes. List employerpaid and employee-paid obligations.
- Identify reporting periods and requirements for employer tax deposits. Prepare mid-year and year-end Employer Tax. Reporting and deposits.
- Prepare payroll-related general journal and general ledger entries.
