

Federal Income Tax

ACCT - 2520 501

Online

Course Description

Accounting 2520 is an intensive beginning course in federal income tax law and personal income tax preparation. The goal in this course is for students to become proficient in the preparation of many personal federal income tax returns.

Pre-Requisite(s): ACCT 1120 or ACCT 2010 or ACCT 2010 or ACCT 2600

Semester: Fall & Spring

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Construct a federal income tax return from given information.
- Identify relevant data to include on a federal income tax return.
- Identify which form(s) and schedule(s) are necessary when completing a federal income tax return.
- Apply the federal income tax laws to given taxpayer scenarios.
- Compute the total for each federal income tax form or schedule.
- Compute the federal income taxes due.
- Assemble the federal income tax return in the correct order.
- Describe the ethical considerations inherently involved in federal income tax preparation.

Course Prerequisites

ACCT 1110 or ACCT 1250 or ACCT 2010 or ACCT 2600

Keys for Success (how to succeed in the course)

Accounting, including federal income taxes, is not an easy topic for most students and one that is almost impossible to cram for. If you wait until the due date to start this work, you will quickly become frustrated and run out of time. Getting behind on the coursework is not advisable.

Each week, spend the time necessary to learn/practice/understand the course concepts and complete the assignments. As a 3 credit class, you should expect to spend about 9 hours per week on the course. But, keep in mind that some students will get through the materials more quickly and others will need additional time.

Brief Description of Assignments/Exams

Graded work for this class is comprised of the following types of assignments:

1. **Reading** assignments, due on Mondays and found in Connect, should be completed as we begin each chapter. The assignments include a series of questions relating to the chapter content.
2. **Discussion** assignments, due on Mondays and found in Canvas, allow us to interact as a class.

3. **Homework** assignments, due on Tuesdays and found in Connect, cover the entire chapter. They are comprised of short answer and fill-in-the-blank questions. Homework should be worked on as you learn the materials contained in the chapter.
4. **Quizzes**, due on Tuesdays and found in Connect, will be taken along with each chapter. Quizzes are comprised of multiple-choice questions relating to the topics discussed in each chapter.
5. **Comprehensive problems** (CP), which are tax returns, are due on Wednesdays and found in Connect or in Canvas, are assigned for select chapters. Multi-chapter CPs will also be completed. When working the problems in Connect, you can use the "check my work" feature multiple times. However, I recommend that you complete the entire assignment before using your first "check my work" click.
6. **Other** assignments, including brief research or current event assignment, due on Wednesdays and found in Canvas, provide the opportunity to explore other areas of taxation.
7. Two **mid-term exams**, taken at the SLCC testing center or with an approved proctor, focus on about 5 or 6 chapters each. The mid-terms will be formatted similar to the homework and quizzes. You may reference your textbook and notes when taking Midterm exams.
8. And finally, a **final project** (a comprehensive tax return) will be due early during finals week.

Grading Scale

Course grades are determined by the students' achieved percentage based upon the relative weighting for course assignments and examinations. Your final grade is weighted as follows:

Additional Policies

Attendance or Participation

This is an online class. However, this class contains several interactive assignments. Your participation in working through the assignments, in a timely manner, is vital to your success.

Late Work

Students tend to be more successful when they stay current on the course assignments. To encourage relatively timely submission of assignments, late work is allowed as follows:

- Reading and Discussion assignments are only available to be submitted late for one week.
- Homework, Comprehensive Problems and Quizzes completed in Connect will be open at least 2 weeks prior to their due date and will be available through the end of the semester, but are recommended to be completed by the due date of the exam which that chapter refers to. Late penalties will not be assessed on assignments completed in Connect.
- The syllabus quiz and other assignments completed in Canvas, including those completed by hand will be open at least 2 weeks prior to their due date and will only be available for one week beyond their due date, unless prior arrangements are made for extenuating circumstances. Late assignments will be subject to a late penalty of 2% per day, with a maximum of 15%.
- Exams are taken on select days. Late exams are subject to a late penalty of 15%, if prior arrangements for extenuating circumstances have not been made.

Midterm Exams

Midterm Exams for this class will be taken in the SLCC testing center, or with an approved proctor. You may reference your textbook and notes while taking exams. Students are expected to work independently on the midterm exams.

Final Project

In lieu of a final exam, a final project will be due on Tuesday during finals week. The project will consist of a comprehensive tax return. Students are expected to work independently on the final project.

Extra Credit

There are a few opportunities over the course of the semester for you to earn extra credit points. You can receive extra credit by participating in the CP discussion boards and by completing a reflection paper connected to the final project. You will also receive a portion of extra credit in order to compensate for grading irregularities in Connect.
