# World Prehistory (SS)

### Course Description

This class is an introduction to the several million-year-old archaeological record of human prehistory. Students will examine broad patterns in prehistory and explore the richness of human creativity in foraging and farming cultures, as well as early states and empires.

### Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Identify the major theoretical paradigms and methods used in the field of archaeology and explain how archaeologists use these to reconstruct past lifeways.
- Identify the natural and anthropogenic processes which create and preserve the prehistoric material record (i.e., fossils, artifacts, and sites) and critically evaluate their impacts on our interpretations.
- Work as a team to apply the methods of archaeologists, explore important course concepts, and communicate results.
- Identify key issues and debates within the study of prehistory (including the origins of anatomically modern humans, the transition from foraging to agricultural lifeways, and the development of state societies aka "civilizations") and evaluate the strength of competing hypotheses derived from the archaeological record.
- Identify the various cultural adaptations used by prehistoric cultures in different environmental contexts across the globe.

- Identify and describe the complexity and diversity of prehistoric human cultural adaptations by exploring selected examples in depth.
- Analyze the importance of cultural heritage and explore how contemporary and historical viewpoints have impacted the preservation of prehistoric archaeological materials as well as our interpretations of them.
