

Intro to Photography (AR)

ART - 1050 001

Course Description

Examines the important contribution of photography and photographers in the field of art. Students will learn basic operations of a digital or film SLR camera (which is required for course), perform shooting assignments, learn visual rules of composition, and conduct research. For non-art/photography majors.

- Explain and demonstrate competent use of camera equipment.
- Print photographs using at home or professional service.
- Utilize the qualities of light and lighting to create photographs.
- Implement the elements of composition.
- Create a portfolio that showcases a photographic story.
- Explore how photography is used as a universal communication media.
- Examine the history and social impact of photography.
- Utilize styles, trends, and technology related to photography.
- Classify camera formats and lenses.
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Engagement Plan

Example language:

Keys for Success (how to succeed in the course)

1. Daily Visuals assignments. These assignments are intended to get you into the habit of seeing and making photographs in the normal routine of your life. You do not need to take dedicated time to go out to photograph, you just need to have a camera with you at all times, and your cell phone camera will work for these images if that is the only camera you have with you.

2. Technical assignments will be demonstrated in class. Please attempt to follow the examples in Canvas. These assignments are intended to familiarize you with basic camera functions and how you can control those functions in order to make the best possible images.

3. Creative assignments are designed to let you explore making photographs you would not ordinarily attempt. They can give you creative challenges that will help you develop your photographic and visual communication skills. Some will have specific requirements and others are open for you to explore your personal interests.

4. The Historical and Photographer We Should All Know More About, assignments are simple research and presentation projects that enable each class member to learn a bit of photographic history and be exposed to some of the most influential photographers from the past. Everyone will learn a lot about your personal subjects and will learn a bit from the presentations of your classmates.

Additional Materials

You will need to have photo processing software. The industry standards are Adobe Lightroom Classic and Photoshop with Bridge. You can download the software at no charge by downloading the Adobe Creative Cloud using your SLCC ID and Password.

There are other imaging and processing software that you may choose to use. Ask about options in class.

General Education Information

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This course fulfills the above requirement for the General Education Program at Salt Lake Community College.
