Typography & Layout

ART - 1230 661

Course Description

This course combines the study of typography with the fundamentals of layout. Students will study the history of letters and will learn to identify various typefaces. They will solve layout problems using design principles and type.

Prerequisite: ART 1120 and ART 1200 with concurrency. Completion of prerequisites prior to ART 1230 is preferred.

Semester: All

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Identify and recognize typefaces based on typeface classifications and characteristics.
- Read about and discuss the history and evolution of typefaces and letterforms.
- Identify common type and layout problems and discuss possible solutions.
- Create preliminary layouts using the design process and industry standard guiding principles for layout design including, but not limited to: research, thumbnails, roughs, comps, final designs, photo indicators, and type indicators.
- Use page, text, and image organizing techniques to solve common design and layout problems.
- Produce final digital layouts and projects using industry-standard software and application techniques.
- Present their work to the class through oral, written, and visual communication.
- Provide constructive feedback to their peers through formal and informal critiques.

Engagement Plan

Example language:

- I will respond to email within 24-48 business hours. I will offer feedback on major assignments within two weeks. The best way to contact me is via the Canvas Inbox, as I will prioritize this email over other modes of communication.
- In this course I will be posting interactive announcements which will offer specific opportunities for class questions and extra credit every other week.
- Additionally, I will be participating in the discussion forums with you to share my perspective within the discipline and to offer some nuances of interpretation that may not be present in your textbook.
- Lastly, we'll be holding small group Q & A sessions, where we can learn from our peers (and faculty) on some of the more difficult units within the course.

Brief Description of Assignments/Exams

Knowledge Building Assessments

- Module Quizzes: There is no time limit. Students can use their textbook and lecture notes and visit their instructor during office hours to ask for help.
- Miscellaneous Discussions & Activities
- Creative Projects: These are equally as difficult as Major Creative Projects but are approached in a more open way. Students are encouraged to use the Creative Projects to practice meeting the requirements of the major projects. They even practice critiquing the work of their peers before submitting a Formal Critique activity.

Major Assessments & Exams (more difficult coursework)

- Major Creative Projects: Students are expected to submit their best work. It is not
 expected that instructors will allow students to fix and resubmit their major creative
 projects.
