Course Description

Introduction to visual storytelling, as applied to conceptualizing storyboards and animatics for various time based mediums. It is recommended students complete ART 1620 prior to taking this course.

- Demonstrate structuring the contrast or affinity of the following BASIC VISUAL COMPONENTS to correspond with intensity of the story.
- Create and show differences in some of the TYPES OF STORYBOARDS.
- Demonstrate TECHNICAL skills as they relate to creating storyboards and animatics.
- Exhibit traits of PROFESSIONAL RESPONSIBILITY.
- Demonstrate WORK FLOW as it relates to creating storyboards and animatics.
