Course Description

Value and light logic are explored using paint medium. Course includes fundamentals of color theory. Included: color mixing, painting techniques and materials. Composition, creative use of value, and image building are covered.

Pre-requisite: ART 1110 Semester(s): Fall & Spring

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Students will demonstrate substantive knowledge and skill in the use of light logic and rendering of form through value using paint materials.
- Students will demonstrate substantive knowledge laws of light logic and its uses in portraying a convincing illusion of three-dimensional reality.
- Students will demonstrate substantive skill in the process of image building using shape and value massing. This will include the steps of simplified shape/value massing, leading to smaller detail and texture.
- Students will demonstrate substantive skill in the implementation of principles of color theory and application. This will include an understanding of key terms associated with color theory and the science of light, aerial perspective, subjective, additive color mixing, and the psychological effects of color.
- Students will demonstrate mastery of various painting materials and techniques. Student will demonstrate ability to mix and apply paint, use of glazes, mediums, and complete projects that involve various painting surfaces.
