Course Description

Third in series of four courses. Second-year ASL courses increase functional language ability focusing on expressive and receptive skills in ASL as well as increased focus on American Deaf Culture (philosophies, history, geography, literature, etc.).

Pre-Requisite(s): Successful completion of ASL 1020 with C grade or better, or placement by test.

Semester(s) Taught: Fall, Spring

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Communicate in ASL.
- Gain knowledge and understanding of Deaf culture.
- Make connections with other disciplines by acquiring information about hose disciplines through the use of ASL and an understanding of Deaf culture.

- Develop insights into the nature of language and culture through comparisons of ASL and Deaf culture and their own culture.
- Participate in the Deaf community through the use of ASL and with knowledge of Deaf culture.
