Brief Description of Assignments/Exams

Get to Know You

This first discussion board is designed to help you introduce yourself and start building connections with your classmates. You will reflect on what matters most to you and share it with others in a creative way. This activity helps you reflect on your values while also beginning to form a supportive classroom community. By seeing what others choose to represent themselves, you'll start to notice similarities, differences, and unique perspectives that can enrich your learning experience.

Discussion #1: What's Your Story?

Purpose: This first discussion helps you strengthen self-awareness by reflecting on your life experiences and the ways they have shaped your thinking, choices, and values. Developing self-awareness is an essential foundation for career exploration, goal setting, and workplace success.

Overview: You will write your personal story in a structured way, focusing on the circumstances, traditions, people, and experiences that make you unique. This process encourages you to reflect on your past, understand yourself in the present, and think about your future dreams. You will also engage with classmates by reading their stories and contributing thoughtful responses, building community and learning from diverse perspectives.

Discussion 2: Someone Else's Story

In this assignment, you will strengthen your self-awareness by learning from others. You will interview someone you don't know very well—such as a professor, staff member,

classmate, co-worker, or professional—and ask about their background and the life experiences that have shaped them. With their permission, you will also take a photo together to include in your post.

Strong Work Ethic Survey

This is a quiz that should be considered more of a check-in with your work ethic. Developing a good work ethic at college will translate to a good work ethic in your career. While work ethic can differ from culture to culture or even business industry to business industry, these questions will be for generalized work ethic that is most often rewarded in the US and specific to your success in this particular course.

Explore Diversity Approval

Before attending your diversity experience, you must first submit a short description for approval. In this step, you will identify the cultural event or activity you plan to attend and explain why you chose it. Your experience can include a festival, celebration, religious service, performance, restaurant, or other cultural activity.

Discussion: Diversity Experience

In this assignment, you will explore diversity through personal experience. The goal is to step outside your comfort zone, participate in a cultural event, and reflect on what you learn about others and yourself.

What you will do:

- Attend one event that introduces you to another culture (festival, celebration, religious service, performance, restaurant, etc.).
- Take a photo of yourself participating in or attending the event, and include it with your discussion post.

Discussion: Volunteer Experience

In this discussion assignment, you will strengthen your self-awareness by engaging in 2 hours of direct volunteer service within your community. The purpose is to reflect not only on the people you are serving but also on what the experience teaches you about yourself.

Reflection: Diversity and Volunteer Experience

This reflection serves as the capstone for the module, asking you to connect all of your experiences together. You will reflect on your personal story, the interview you conducted, your diversity experience, and your volunteer project, while also considering what you learned from classmates' stories. The assignment challenges you to think about how diversity shapes communities, how self-understanding improves connections, and how these insights might guide your future career path. Your reflection should be written in at least five paragraphs and will only be read by your instructor.

Additional Policies

Late Work Policy

All assignments are expected to be completed and submitted by the stated due date. To prepare you for the workforce, where deadlines are critical, I enforce a strict late work policy:

Late Penalty: Assignments lose 30% of the total grade per day late. For example, if an assignment is submitted 1 day late, the highest possible score is 70%. After 4 days, the assignment will not receive any credit.

Extensions: If you experience circumstances that prevent you from completing work on time, you may request an extension before the due date.

Requests made on the same day the assignment is due will not be approved unless there are extenuating circumstances (such as emergencies).

Working Ahead: You are encouraged to work ahead to avoid conflicts with deadlines.
