Woodworking & Millwork I

CMGT - 1220 001

Course Description

This course explores the basic principles of woodworking. Safety will be discussed in depth. Topics include the theory & hands-on application of joinery, design, cut-lists, stock preparation & assembly. An assigned skill building project utilizing techniques such as frame & panel construction. Includes an introduction to use wood veneers as a sustainable practice. Typical project cost: \$100.

Semester: Fall

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Safe operation of power equipment.
- Learn design principles used in a controlled classroom project.
- Introduced to common hardware options commonly used in woodworking and the methods used to research proper applications & use of desired hardware.
- Learn joinery methods & cut-listing skills for the controlled classroom project.
- Learn the proper procedures for cut-out & assembly of the controlled classroom project.
- Learn basic wood finishing techniques including sanding, basic coloring & top coating.
- Begin the process of developing their own design for a future project.

Engagement Plan

Attendance & Participation:

In order for students to understand the theories and processes used in woodworking, daily attendance is important. This class is designed to build upon itself daily so excessive absences will be detrimental to your grade.

Research projects:

Each student will select two aspects of woodworking that appeal to them and make a presentation to the class. Examples include topics like types of joinery, styles of furniture, finishing techniques, and others.

Cleanup:

The cleanup process is one of the outcomes that the Building Construction Department feels is crucial to the student's professional image. Students will each have an area of the shop they will be responsible to make sure gets cleaned on a daily basis.

All Students will be responsible to:

- 1. Check-in tools promptly at clean up time.
- 2. Store all projects and materials safely.
- 3. Clean up personal work areas.
- 4. Perform general clean up and de-junk of shop.
- 5. Assure stock rooms & glue cart are left in good order.

Keys for Success (how to succeed in the course)

Students will draw upon their knowledge and skills to design and build a project utilizing a variety of woodworking techniques. Class instruction each day includes a one-hour lecture on woodworking theory from our text. There will also be frequent lectures and demonstrations throughout our woodshop lab time.

Students who attend class, actively listen, inquire when they need help, help others, and follow instructions will be successful.

Brief Description of Assignments/Exams

Class includes three assignments: 1) a class group project, 2) a research project, and 3) a presentation/final exam.
