

# Const Project Management

CMGT - 2810 001

## Course Description

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This course allows students to work in groups and put into practice aspects of project execution, planning, scheduling, project controls & supervision of light commercial and residential construction projects. Jobsite documents, labor relations & workflow analysis are covered. It is designed to utilize knowledge from all other construction management courses on a final capstone project.

Prereq: CMGT 1410, 1450, 2640 & 2670.

Semester: Fall & Spring

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- Understand how to prepare and present a project using software such as Power Point.
- Learn Project Management concepts.
- Understand Project Scheduling Processes & Methods.
- Comprehend phases of construction in the scheduling process.
- Be familiar with Budget & Cost Controls.
- Understand Quality Assurance principles.
- Understanding the importance of Value Engineering and the balancing of Cost, Quality & Time.
