Vocabulary quizzes test the important economic terms introduced in each chapter.

Chapter assignments are designed to focus on an important concept(s) from each chapter. These assignments may take a variety of formats requiring graphs, calculations, written explanations, or discussions. By working these assignments, you are developing your knowledge of these concepts and preparing for the chapter quiz and exam.

Internet exercises focus on accessing and analyzing up-to-date data sources and publications related to each chapter.

Each **chapter quiz** covers one week of material. You may use your textbook and notes for chapter quizzes. *Use of AI and other general internet resources is prohibited.*

Each **exam** covers three weeks of material. **ALL exams will be taken at an SLCC Testing Center.** A handwritten note sheet (One 8 x 11 piece of paper, front and back) may be used on the exam.

Our course will use a common weekly due date of Sundays at 11:59pm. However, because the Testing Centers are not open on the weekends. Exams are due by Fridays at 8:00pm.

All work, including exams, is submitted online through Canvas.

Be sure to read all instructions.

You are allowed only one attempt on all assessments.
