# Knitwear Design

## Course Description

Knitwear Design students will design and construct professional clothing from stretch knit fabrics by providing students with the techniques and skills necessary to design, clone, pattern, drape, and construct stretch fabric garments using a serger, and also help students combine the correct stretch fabrics and sewing skills required for the type of clothing that is designed.

Pre-Requisite(s): FASH 1100 Semester(s): Fall & Spring

## Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Demonstrate proficiency in basic serger skills and techniques.
- Demonstrate proficiency in the use and operation of a cover lock machine.
- Demonstrate the ability to construct a T-shirt clone including pattern making and construction.
- Correctly draft and construct industry RTW quality tops, skirts and pants using student's personal measurements.
- Grade patterns for stretch knit classifications.
- Re-design and sew a knit top and coordinated outfit or dress.
- Demonstrate the ability to correctly distinguish and identify different fabric swatches of varied knit fabrics.
- Demonstrate proficiency at selecting the correct knit fabric for a selected garment.
