Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Connect the concepts of adolescent development in contemporary society from early adolescence through emerging adulthood.
- Explain major theories in the study of adolescent development understand physical, mental, emotional, social, and personal characteristics of this stage of development and how these stages connect with the home, school, social groups, and the community.
- Develop critical literacies through interactive classroom sessions, assigned readings, a series of written assignments, and a research project.
- Participate in formal and informal peer presentations addressing both historical and contemporary issues in adolescent development.
- Gather, interpret, and analyze information gathered from observations and interviews.
- Learn to monitor, assess, and analyze research, gain an understanding of formal and informal methods for evaluating research in both assigned reading, video clips, and researching a defined topic.
- Critically analyze and synthesize contemporary issues in adolescent psychology, examine personal, cultural, and philosophical beliefs and how these beliefs can affect our view of development.
- Engage in reflective thinking and expression through a series of written assignments and make connections between adolescence and all of human development.
- Participate in several field experience observations of adolescents in a variety of settings.

Coursework & Assignment Descriptions

Assignments (30% of your final grade)

Written assignments are an essential component of your learning experience and provide an opportunity for you to critically analyze theory and practice. Each assignment will give you several topics to choose from. Instructions and topics are posted on each chapter's assignment page.

You are not required to do a written essay assignment for each chapter, but one essay of the options for every other chapter. For example, choose one option from Chapters 1 & 2.

In order to receive full credit, assignments must be submitted on time, be typed using standard 1" margins and 12 pt. Times New Roman font, and written in a professional manner. Each assignment topic must fully address key components of the question or scenario, and the Answer section of your essay must be 500 words in length.

Assignments are graded on a ten-point scale. Follow the course calendar for due dates. COMPUTER ISSUES ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE REASONS FOR LATE WORK!!

Quizzes (30% of your final grade)

A series of brief multiple-choice, true/false, and essay tests will serve to assess your learning in this course as well as deepen your understanding of adolescent growth and development. All tests are taken online; test dates are listed on the course calendar. Tests are open for a week prior to the due date.

The first four chapter quizzes will be open-book quizzes, so you can get a feel for the software and the class. For the open-book quizzes, you may use your book, your notes, and any other resource except another person. The remaining quizzes will be closed-book quizzes, where you may not use any resource (other than your memory).

Quizzes will require the LockDown Browser software. Instructions for downloading/installing the software are posted on the Technology and Software page in the Getting Started section of Canvas. The software allows you to take quizzes off-campus and uses your device's webcam and microphone to proctor your quizzes, which can then be reviewed by your professor. Like Canvas, the LockDown Browser complies with federal privacy laws to protect your information. IMPORTANT: Please take note of the following:

- Equipment: If you do not have the necessary equipment to use the LockDown Browser, you must notify me within the first week of class to make other arrangements.
- Ebooks: If you are using an ebook for the class, you will need to use TWO devices for open-book quizzes: one device to take the quiz with the LockDown Browser and a separate device to access the ebook. For example, you could take the quiz on a laptop and access the ebook on your phone.

Discussions (15% of your final grade)

Each week students will participate in a discussion based on course material. Weekly discussion points will focus on child growth and development, specific theories, and controversial subjects. To enhance your learning and professional growth, it is important to read other students' responses. You may submit comments to peer responses as well. IN ORDER TO RECEIVE ALL 3 POINTS for the discussion, you must post your discussion comment and also comment on the posts of two other class members.

Class Project (25% of your final grade)

Students will participate in a research project to provide a deeper understanding of historical frameworks, topic definitions, and critical analysis of issues in the field of adolescent development. A key element of research is sharing findings with others. The research project is your choice of two options: a formal paper OR a presentation. Additional information is available on the assignment page. The project grading page will look like you need to do both options, but when you complete the research paper OR the podcast, I will "excuse" the other.

Additional Class Policies

LATE WORK POLICY:

Except for Discussion Boards and the Final, which cannot be submitted late, late work on all other assignments and quizzes will be accepted up to 4 days late with a deduction of 10% per day (0.04% per hour), but please note that Canvas is a computer so it is very strict about the 11:59 p.m. deadline and will round up to the next whole hour block.

EXAMPLE: assignment is due at 11:59 on Friday and you turn it in at 12:05 a.m. on Saturday, Canvas will count that as one hour late. The assignment will be graded and scored just like any other student's work, and then Canvas will reduce the score by 0.04% per hour.

So a perfect 100% assignment =

- 1. Unless it's your own idea directly from your own head, include a citation and reference.
- 2. If it's knowledge that you've already accumulated from somewhere else previously and it is now in your own head, you still need a citation and reference. Unless it's a commonly accepted fact like: the sky is blue.
- 3. Never copy and paste anything from anywhere into your paper unless you are putting quotation marks around it, with a citation and reference.
- 4. While reading through a source, take notes in your own words. Then when you go to write your submission, you can refer to your notes and know they are your own words. But still include a citation and reference, because even though they are your own words, they are not your own ideas.

5. Do not use AI and claim that it is your own writing and ideas.
