Human Geography

GEOG - 1400 001

Course Description

The course introduces students to the systematic study of patterns and processes that have shaped human understanding, use, and alteration of Earth's surface. Students employ spatial concepts and landscape analysis to examine socioeconomic organization and its environmental consequences. They also learn about the methods and tools geographers use in their research and applications.

Semester: All

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Apply the technology used to measure and analyze natural processes, such as satellite imagery, aerial photography, geographic information systems (GIS), global positioning systems (GPS), and other forms of scientific data.
- Characterize and analyze changing interconnections among around the world places.
- Interpret the relationships among patterns and processes at different scales of analysis.
- Describe some of the problems of economic development and cultural change.
- Examine the implications of population growth, changing fertility rates, and international migration.
- Explain the technological innovation on transportation, communication, industrialization, and other aspects of human life.
- Analyze the struggles over political power and control of territory.

- Examine conflicts over the demands of ethnic minorities, the role of women in society, and the inequalities between developed and developing economies.
- Compare how and why location matters to agricultural land use, industrial development, and urban problems.
- Analyze the role of climate change and environmental abuses in shaping the human landscapes of Earth.
