- Demonstrate understanding of and ability to deal with special issues associated with recording live performances of musical sound as compared to recording in a controlled studio environment.
- Demonstrate ability to work in a collaborative setting on team-based musical audio projects.

• Demonstrate the ability to analyze and respond critically to a musical recording.
