

Transition to Prof. Nursing

Course Description

Facilitates the transition from nursing student to professional nurse. With a focus on teamwork, collaboration, communication, quality, safety and professionalism, students are prepared to enter the workforces as professional nurses. NRSG 2410 also has a focus on preparation to pass the NCLEX exam.

Pre-Requisite(s): Completion of prior semester courses per established curriculum plan.

Semester(s) Taught: All

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Identify and integrate principles of teamwork into the operation of the interdisciplinary health care team.
- Identify and apply leadership skills and empowerment strategies when managing the care of patients.
- Identify and perform nursing care and delegate tasks within the legal parameters of that entity's scope and practice, ensuring culturally sensitive, safe, quality care to patients.
- Explore the nurse's role as an advocate for individuals, families, and health care team, regarding health care decisions and health-related education, through the use of appropriate communication skills.
- Employ critical thinking skills through psychometric test taking strategies for NCLEX preparation.

Course Prerequisites

Completion of prior semester courses by an established curriculum plan.

Brief Description of Assignments/Exams

Service & Community Activity

The Legislative Advocacy Project serves as the central CEL activity for NRSG 2410. Instead of completing 15 service hours separately, you will meet this requirement through your project. Activities include:

- Researching a nursing-relevant legislative issue in Utah (e.g., staffing ratios, access to care, social determinants of health).
- Engaging with your capstone preceptors, other nurses, and community residents or patients affected by the issue during your 100-hour capstone experience and advocacy activities to gather insights.
- Completing all in-class discussions, activities, and assignments associated with the project.
- Drafting and sending a professional advocacy email to a legislator and submitting reflective work (discussion, feeling collage/posterboard, and essay/video).
This approach integrates research, community engagement, and advocacy to fulfill the 15-hour requirement, allowing you to apply classroom knowledge to real-world issues while developing professional and civic skills.

Methods of Course Instruction & Engagement

- Canvas modules and assignments.
- Classroom Q&A sessions.
- Interactive discussion boards.
- Instructor participation in discussions to add nursing practice perspectives.
- Guest speakers.

Capstone Assignments Detail

Here are the assignments. They must be completed by the end of your capstone rotation, except for the first assignment, which must be completed before you begin your capstone rotation.

☒ SMART Goal

Setting professional goals is a standard part of employment in the healthcare field. Usually, you will be required to write 3-5 professional goals each year to be evaluated on at the end of the year. For this goal, we want you to write a goal that you have for yourself in your capstone rotation. Use the SMART goal format (detailed in the assignment) to write your goal.

▯ Prioritization and Time Management

As you start your workday, it's a good idea to have a basic plan for how you'll approach the known tasks you'll be performing during your shift. This assignment includes an article that will help guide how to prioritize tasks. The assignment itself asks you to reflect on methods you can use to help set priorities.

That being said, it is often the case that your priorities will need to shift based on unexpected events that occur while you are on shift, so don't always count on it going as smoothly as you had hoped. As a Physical Therapist friend once told me: "If you have a plan, you have a chance."

▯ Delegation

Delegation is a vital skill for safe, patient-centered care. As a nurse, you must use sound judgment, clear communication, and professional boundaries when deciding what tasks to delegate.

In this assignment, you will reflect on how delegation was used in your Capstone setting with guidance from your preceptor. Be sure to connect your observations to the Five Rights of Delegation: Right Task, Right Circumstance, Right Person, Right Direction/Communication, and Right Supervision/Evaluation.

▯ Medication Knowledge

Safe medication administration is one of the most critical responsibilities of nursing practice. It requires a strong knowledge base, attention to detail, and consistent use of the Six Rights of Medication Administration to protect patients from harm.

In this assignment, you will reflect on your experiences with medication administration in your Capstone setting. Discuss how you applied medication knowledge, verified accuracy, and ensured patient safety throughout the process.

⚖ Values Survey

As you prepare to transition into professional practice, it's important to explore how your personal values align with different areas of nursing. Understanding what matters most to you can help guide your career choices and increase job satisfaction.

For this assignment, you will complete the Values Survey (quiz) to identify settings where you may be best suited to work as a nurse. The results are designed to help you reflect on your strengths, preferences, and priorities as you plan your future career path.

SBARR

Clear, structured communication is essential for patient safety. The SBARR framework—Situation, Background, Assessment, Recommendation, & Readback—helps nurses share critical information in a concise and organized way.

During your Capstone experience, you will complete this assignment by practicing SBARR to communicate patient information. Your goal is to demonstrate clarity, accuracy, and professionalism when reporting to other members of the healthcare team.
