Appl of Functional Anatomy

PTA - 2015 001

Course Description

This lab course introduces PTA students to human anatomy through cadaver observation and hands-on palpation. Students will identify key anatomical structures in the cadaver lab and develop palpation skills by locating muscles, bones, and landmarks on classmates to build a strong foundation for clinical practice.

Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Demonstrate an understanding of joint integrity and mobility.
- Demonstrate essential palpation skills to identify skeletal landmarks and joint structures.
- Demonstrate appropriate palpation skills to identify specific muscles and/or muscle groups which produce functional movement patterns.
- Demonstrate essential palpation skills to identify the origin and insertion of designated muscles and describe all movement that is produced by each muscle or group.
- Given a case study, evaluate appropriate muscle, origin, insertion, actions, and innervation.

Course Prerequisites

Current enrollment in the PTA program; co-requisite with PTA 2010.

Engagement Plan

Students can communicate with me in person, through Microsoft Teams, Canvas Inbox, or email.

- The best way to contact me, other than in person communication, is via Microsoft Teams. I will prioritize this method of communication over other methods of communication. Course Content Advisory

This course includes cadaver lab sessions involving observation of preserved human anatomical specimens, which may be sensitive for some students. It also includes palpation labs requiring respectful physical contact with classmates to locate anatomical landmarks. Participation in both components is essential for meeting course objectives.

Students with concerns related to cadaver exposure or physical contact are encouraged to speak with the instructor early in the term. Reasonable accommodations or alternative learning arrangements may be available in consultation with program faculty and student support services.

Brief Description of Assignments/Exams

Cadaver lab exams will consist of identification of pinned anatomical structures on human specimens. Palpation exams will be practical, requiring students to demonstrate accurate identification and palpation of anatomical landmarks, muscles, and bony structures on classmates. Both exam types assess anatomical knowledge and hands-on clinical skills.
