# Implement Patient Care Skills

## Course Student Learning Outcomes

- Demonstrate the use of contemporary knowledge and theory, while also considering the patient/client perspective and the environment, based on the plan of care established by the physical therapist.
- Demonstrate appropriate risk management strategies such as universal precautions and safe/efficient clinican body mechanics.
- Demonstrate measurement of standard vital signs and monitor/adjust treatment based on physiological responses to position changes and activity.
- Demonstrate gait and locomotion training in physical therapy including application and adjustment of ambulatory assistive devices; gait training with traditional ambulatory assistive devices; wheelchair fit for safety and comfort, and safe indoor/community independent propulsion.
- Describe and demonstrate the collection and documentation of arousal, attention/mentation, and cognition; determine and document the level of orientation to situation, time, place, and person; assess the patient's ability to process commands.
- Demonstrate safety and emergency procedures which includes ensuring safety of self and others in the provision of care in all situations, initiate and/or participate in emergency life support procedures (simulated or actual), initiate and participate in emergency response system (simulated or actual), maintain competency in CPR, and prepare and maintain a safe working environment for performing interventions (clear walkways, equipment checks).
- Demonstrate appropriate clinical communication including introducing self as a student physical therapist assistant, identifying the patient by at least two identifiers, and requesting permission to work with the patient.
- Create and use components of patient instruction based on principles of learning including a variety of teaching strategies, verbal and visual instructions, and

methods to enhance patient adherence (handouts, reporting forms); and determine patient response/understanding of instructions.

#### **PROFESSIONALISM**

Professional behavior is an essential element in creating a safe and supportive learning environment at

following specific behavioral standards are evaluated to determine the professionalism grade associated

o Consistent Attendance (20 points). Students are expected to attend each scheduled lecture,

(5) points will be deducted per occurrence. Unexcused absences will result in a ten (10) point

deduction per occurrence. An absence may be excused by notifying the Instructor by phone

health appointments (physician, therapist, counselor, dentist, etc.) that do not conflict with published class times.

o Active Participation (15 points). During each class period, multiple opportunities will be provided to ask/answer questions, participate in structured active learning experiences, or to

serve as a model for demonstration of various clinical techniques (including palpation). Students show engagement with the course content, with the Instructor, and with fellow students by including themselves in these activities. Unrelated use of cell phones, social media

platforms, or computers during classroom learning experiences will result in the loss of five (5)

points per occurrence.
